NON-POTABLE IRRIGATION RATE UPDATE

Due to the statewide drought emergency and historically low irrigation water supplies across northern Colorado, available non-potable water supplies have been significantly impacted. To maintain irrigation service for affected customers, North Weld County Water District is temporarily transitioning non-potable irrigation systems to potable (treated) water as the available non-potable supplies are depleted. Because potable water requires additional treatment and delivery, the irrigation rate will temporarily change from \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.19 per 1,000 gallons while potable water is being supplied.



This temporary change only affects customers receiving non-potable irrigation service in the affected subdivisions. Regular potable water rates for all other District customers remain unchanged.

WILDWING

The temporary potable irrigation rate is currently in effect for WildWing customers. Potable water will continue to be provided for irrigation through mid-September.

SADDLER

The temporary potable irrigation rate will take effect with the next billing cycle. Potable water will continue to be provided for irrigation through mid-September.

The District encourages affected customers to use water efficiently during the remaining irrigation period. Adjusting irrigation schedules based on weather conditions and limiting unnecessary watering can help lower overall water use and irrigation costs while potable water is being supplied.
